# Third Sunday of Easter

When you're in it, Lent can seem like a season that lasts forever; but, when you look at the big picture, Easter is just as long - and is actually a little longer.

After His resurrection, Jesus appeared on earth to His disciples: "He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for 'the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days, you will be baptized with the holy Spirit." (Acts 1:3-5)

At the end of this time, Jesus ascended into Heaven. Ten days later, the apostles received the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

These events give us the outline for our celebration of the season of Easter. After Easter Sunday, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, and then four more Sundays of Easter.

The Ascension is traditionally celebrated on the Thursday of the 6th week of Easter (May 9th this year) - forty days after Easter. However, in many dioceses in the United States, including our diocese, the celebration is moved to the 7th Sunday of Easter. Ten days after that Thursday comes the celebration of Pentecost on May 19th and the end of the Easter season.

## Within the season of Easter, we celebrate a few significant feast days as well:

**April 16th** is the feast day of St. Bernadette Soubirous, the French girl who saw the vision of Mary at Lourdes. **April 25th** is the feast of St. Mark, companion of St Paul and the evangelist who wrote one of the Gospels. On **April 29th**, we celebrate **Catherine of Siena**, a Dominican who made an enormous impact on the Church of her time, especially when she worked for the end of the Great Schism.

Finally, on **May 14th**, we celebrate **St**, **Matthias** who took the place of Judas Iscariot among the Apostles after the Ascension of Jesus. It may surprise us, but after they found two worthy options ("men who accompanied us the whole time the Lord Jesus came and went among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day on which he was taken up from us ..."), the apostles "drew lots" to pick Judas' successor. Matthias was chosen - and this is the only place he is mentioned by name in the New Testament.

Easter is a rich season worth celebrating well. As we continue through this time, let's constantly turn our minds and hearts back to the Resurrection of Jesus. Re-read the Gospel passages about this event. Take time to meditate on how the Resurrection impacts your life today.
